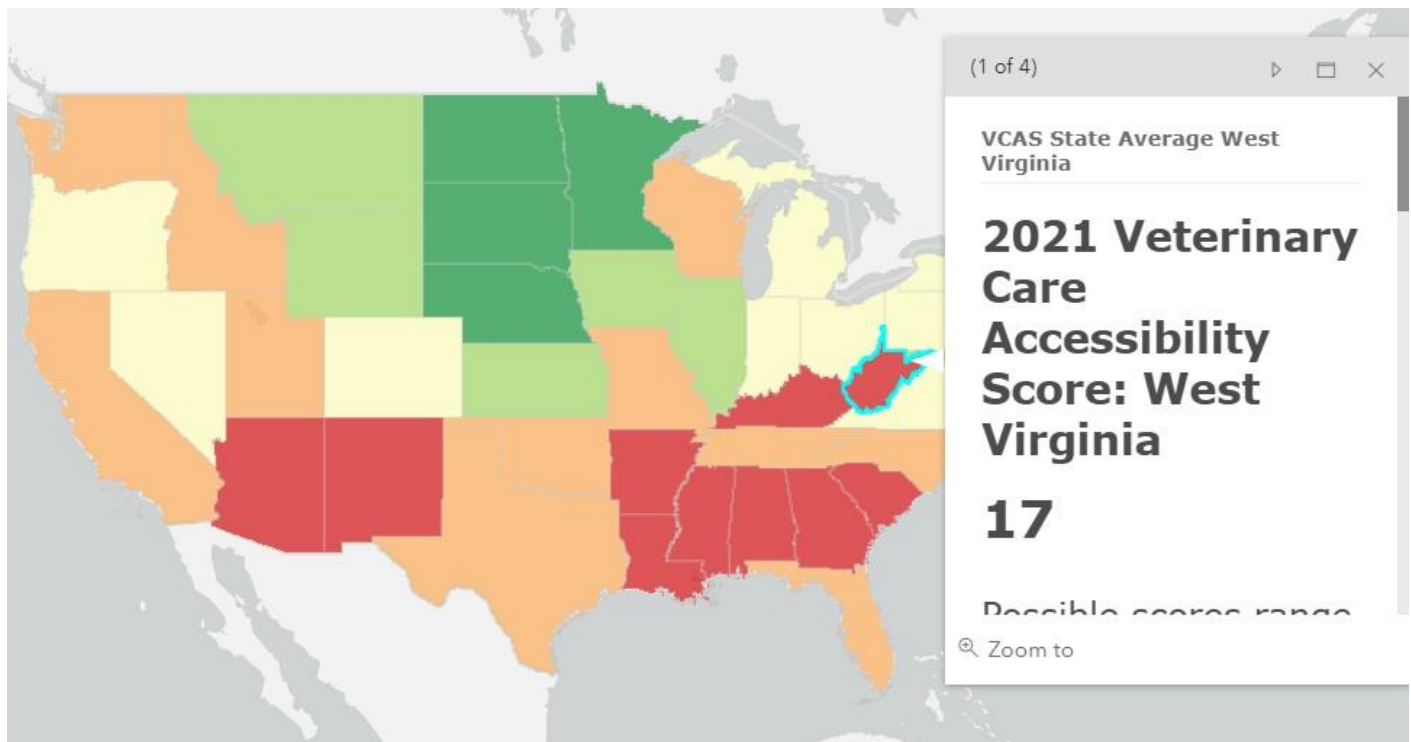

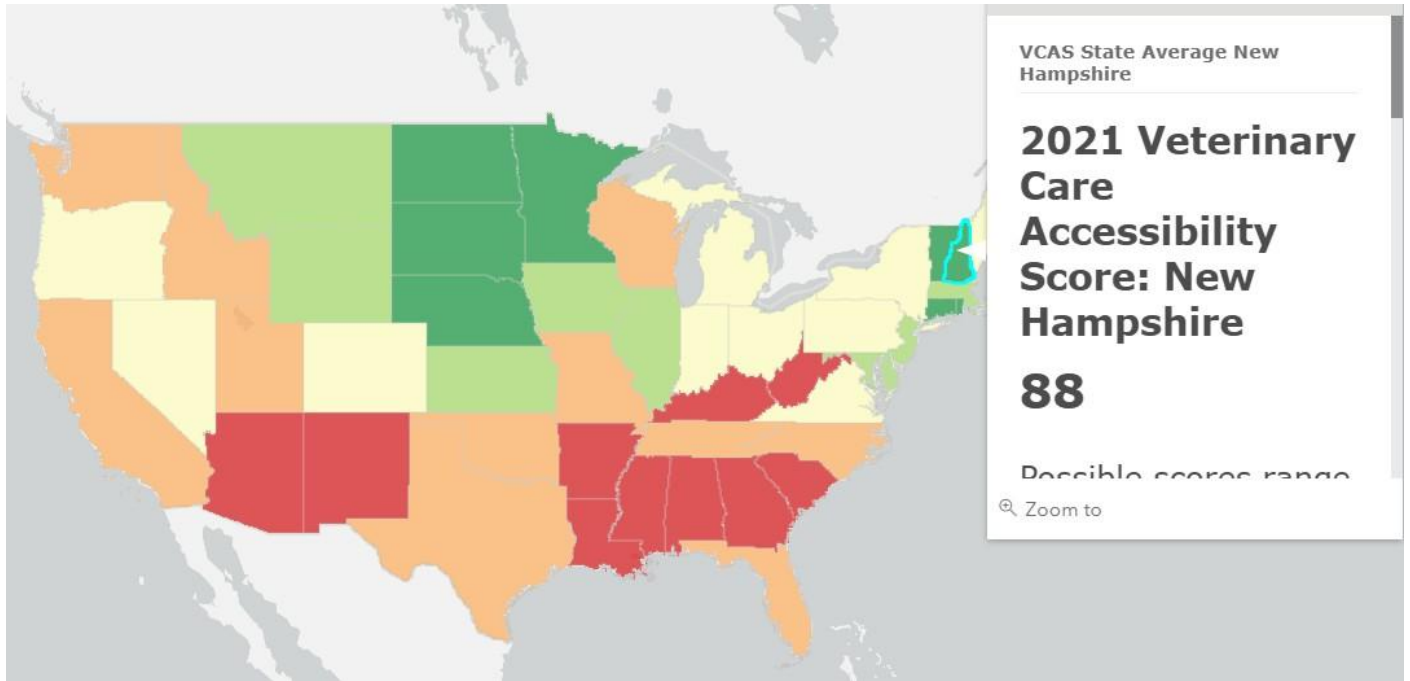

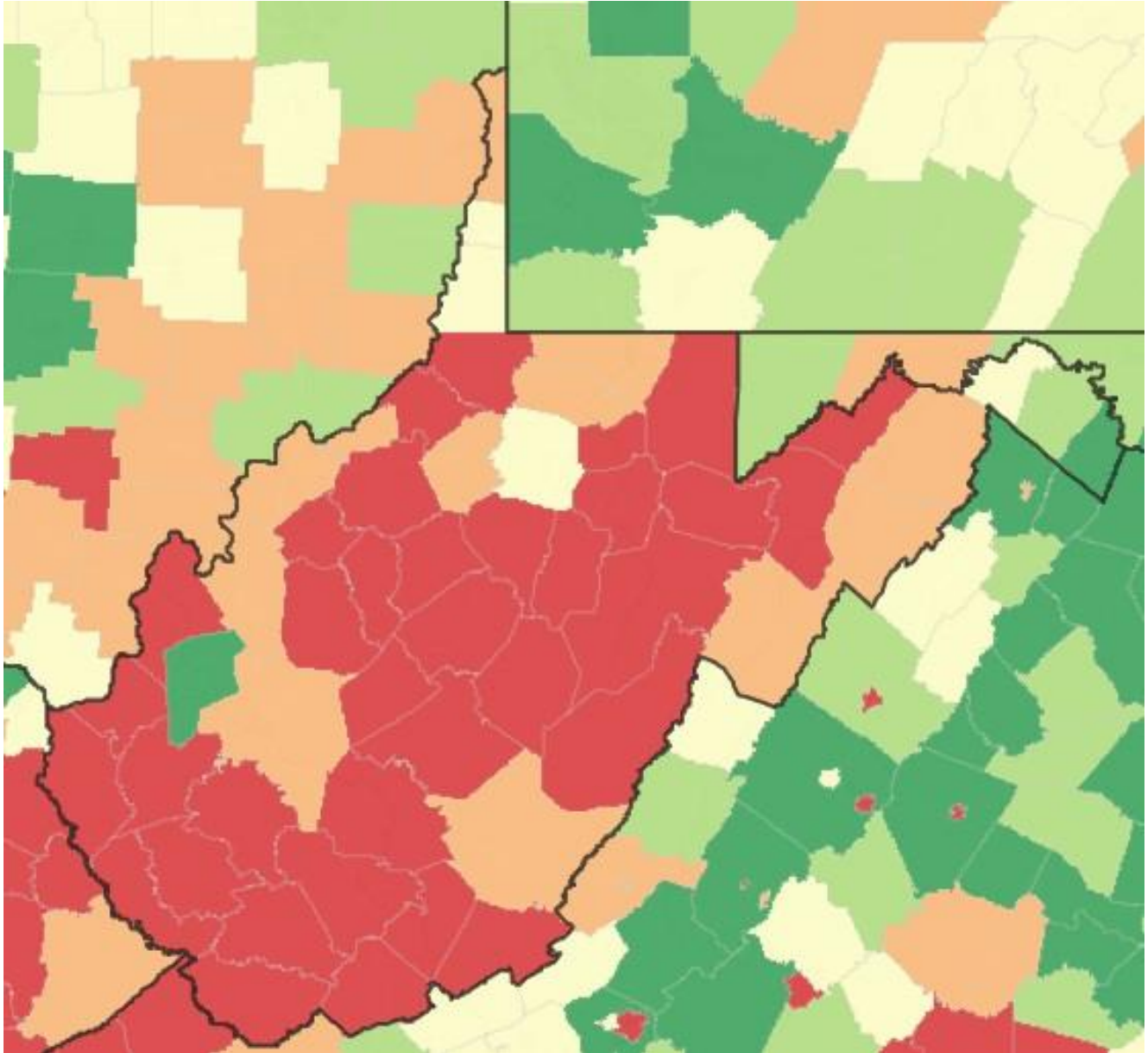
Red shows low access to vet care. WV is 17

Possible scores range from **0** (care is nearly inaccessible) to **100** (care is very accessible).

17 is the average Veterinary Care Accessibility Score for counties throughout the state of **West Virginia**.



New Hampshire has vet access score of 88 just as comparison.
The whole country is still not where it should be.



No surprise to us, look at ALL that red. Those light areas are Morgan, Harrison and Marshall Counties with the highest vet access in WV.
